Organised by Fiera Milano and directed by Nicola Ricciardi, miart—the international modern and contemporary art fair in Milan—is the exhibition that presents the largest chronological offer of artworks in Italy, starting with masterpieces from the early twentieth century (Egon Schiele, Francis Picabia, Giorgio de Chirico) and reaching contemporary blue chip artists (David Hockney, Etel Adnan, Rosa Barba). *Crescendo* was both the title and the keyword of the 27th edition of the fair, emphasizing the range of new or expanded programing, roster of participating galleries, and premier of Milano Art Week.


With 169 galleries from 27 countries, miart 2023 was among the most diverse yet, with an increase of 40% in the international exhibitor roster. The fair's three flagship sections present a comprehensive look at the positioning of modern and contemporary art today: *Established* offers an expansive presentation ranging from modern masters to the most recent artworks; *Decades* highlights historical works from the 20th century, delineated by decade; and *Emergent* spotlights the latest work from the newest generation of artists.

From the first few hours after opening and throughout its entire duration, the fair was very lively, with an increase in the attendance of international VIPs including collectors, art consultants, curators and directors of private foundations and Italian and foreign museums, as well as an increase in the participation of the Italian and international press providing widespread media coverage, and a considerable increase in the number of people attending.

The growth of international participation is also expected to increase in 2024 thanks to the fact that miart is placed in a particularly favorable time frame, in fact the week following the closure of miart they will inaugurate both the Salone del Mobile and the Venice Biennale.







COVIVIO AWARD

In line with the society's philosophy of promoting talented and emerging artists, Covivio Award has been assigned to an artist in the *Emergent* section who will realise a site-specific work with an investment of up to Euro 20,000. The artwork realised by the winning artist will be installed at the Wellio by Covivio proworking space in Via dell'Unione 1, Milan.

The prize went to Lorenza Longhi (1991, Lecco, Italy), at miart 2023 with the gallery Fanta-MLN (Milan).



HENRAUX FOUNDATION SCULPTURE COMMISSION

The first edition of the Henraux Foundation Sculpture Commission provides for the production of a marble work to be unveiled and exhibited at the Museo del Novecento in Milan in April 2024. The Henraux Foundation will activate a residency at the Henraux headquarters and quarries where the artist will have the chance to produce the sculpture, assisted by skilled craftsmen and innovative technologies.

The Orbital Cultura - Nexi Group award is dedicated to photography with the aim to provide Italian historical museums with contemporary and high-quality images. Selected among those represented by the galleries in the *Established* and *Decades* sections, one artist will be commissioned to create, with an award of Euro 10,000, a photographic documentation work of the external buildings and common spaces of a museum complex. The first edition of the prize is dedicated to Gallerie degli Uffizi complex.


MATTEO VISCONTI DI MODRONE PRIZE

In order to present a clearer, more readable allocation of the spaces, the fair's sections have been reduced to three: Established, the main section hosting galleries exhibiting the most contemporary kind of works alongside those dedicated to twentieth century art, not to mention those active in collectibles and signature design; Portal, curated by Julieta González and Abaseh Mirvali, which shows ten exhibitions designed to discover or rediscover - through journeys in time and space, through contaminations and visions - worlds that are only apparently very distant; and Emergent, the section curated by Attilia Fattori Franchini and centred around younger galleries, which will be well- placed at the exhibition entrance in order to highlight research by the youngest generations of gallery owners and artists. PORTAL

The poet Giorgio Caproni once told the story of an English writer who – when accused of not paying attention to current events - replied: "If I want to talk about light, I am not interested in talking about the electric bulb, I am interested in lightning, the flash that belongs to everyone".

In the same way, *Portal* is a deliberately anachronistic section, which nonetheless strips the term of its derogatory hue to restore it to its legitimate meaning - that of scrambling timelines to make sense of our time, capturing in the tumultuous and ever-changing flow of the present what is stable and lasting in art.

Curated by Abaseh Mirvali and Julieta González, the section brings together ten galleries presenting universes and artistic practices that are only apparently very distant: a window to the present, through parallel dimensions and unconventional prisms.
